

EL CAMINO REAL CHARTER HIGH SCHOOL

Summer School 2018

June 15 – July 27

General Information

El Camino Real Charter High School offers summer classes for credit recovery and enrichment. Students who are entering grades 10 – 12 that have received a letter grade of D or FAIL are encouraged to take summer school classes. Each class is two hours long and meets Monday – Friday, with **classes beginning on Friday, June 15th and ending Friday, July 27th**. There will be no school on Wednesday, July 4th, in observance of Independence Day. The standard summer school schedule is as follows:

Period 1: 8:00am – 10:00am
Nutrition: 10:01am – 10:23am
Period 2: 10:30am – 12:30pm

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Students met with their counselors for the upcoming school year in March and discussed summer school at that time. Most students have already turned in their applications. Students are still able to get applications from their counselors, however, spots are filling up quickly so it is suggested they turn it in as soon as possible. Applications are only given out by the student's counselor. The application needs to be signed by the student and the student's parent/guardian.

ELIGIBILITY FOR SUMMER SESSION

- For the 2018 summer session, only students who are in attendance (May 2018) at El Camino Real Charter High School are eligible to pre-register for summer school.
- Students who do not attend El Camino but reside full time within the boundaries of LAUSD may come in on June 12th to apply for classes that are still open, or put their names on a waiting list.
- **El Camino students will be given priority.**

PRE – REGISTRATION/WAITING LIST SIGN UPS: Monday, June 11th (8:00am – 11:00am)

- Students may come to the counseling office on June 11th to find out which classes are still available.
- Students who do not attend El Camino Real Charter High School must provide proof of approval from their current school counselor. They also need to provide proof of receiving a D or FAIL in the class for which they are applying.
- Classes are filled on a first com/first served basis.
- As the classes fill up, students will be asked to put their names and phone numbers on a waiting list. If spots open up, students will be called at the number they listed. Calls for students on the waiting list are made the second day of summer school.

ONLINE CLASSES

- El Camino uses Cyber High for online classes once traditional classes have filled up.
- Students will be required to come in 2 days a week. Either Monday/Wednesday, or Tuesday/Thursday.
- If choosing Mon/Wed, first class starts in library on Mon. June 18. If choosing Tues/Thurs, first class starts Tues. June 19.
- Students will be placed on a "pacing guide" once the online class starts.

ATTENDANCE

Attendance during the fast-paced summer session is extremely important and mandatory for credit recovery and for elective credit. Students must attend the first day of summer school or their spot will be given to someone else. Students should plan to attend class **every day** for the full period. If a student misses more than 2 days, he/she will be dropped from his/her class(es). While family vacations are important, if your family has one scheduled during the summer session, then this is not the summer for participation in the program.

Tentative Course Offerings

Not all of the following courses will be offered. Actual offerings will depend on number of students requesting specific courses. If your first choice(s) is not available, you may receive your second choice.
